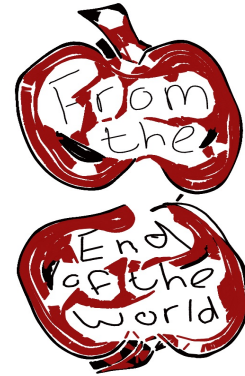


From the End of the World
